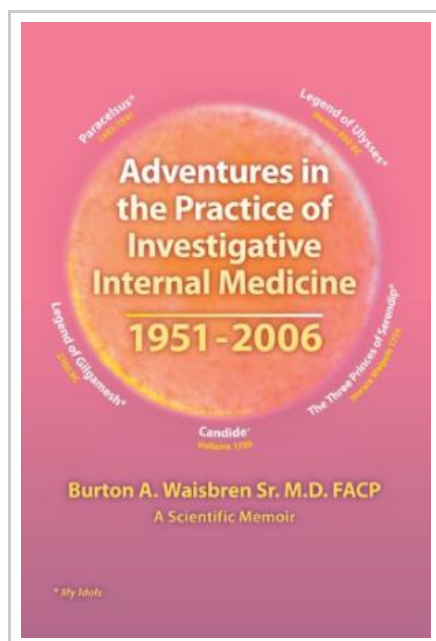




Adventures in the Practice of Investigative Internal Medicine 1951-2006: A Scientific Memoir (Paperback)

Dr. Waisbren has been practicing internal medicine, teaching students at First Marquette Medical School and then at the Medical College of Wisconsin, ever since. He has been director of the infectious disease control service at the Milwaukee County Hospital,...
